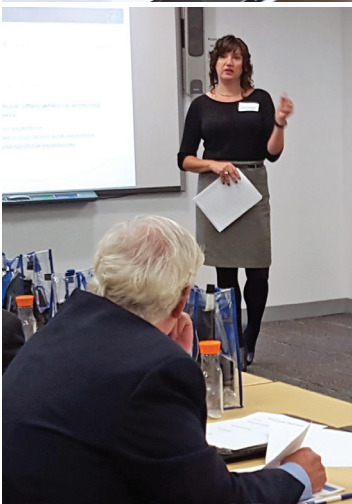
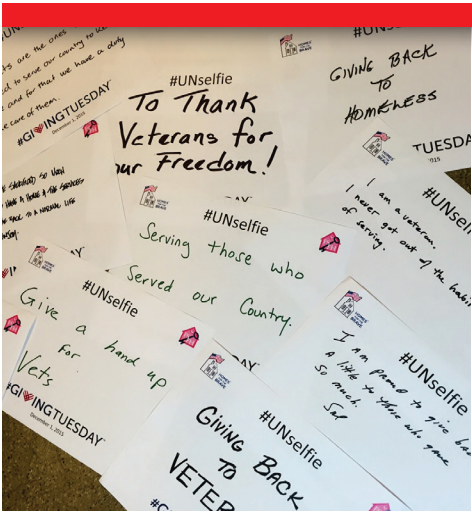

MORE THAN 1000 SERVED

In FY 2016, ABRI/*Homes for the Brave* served its 1000th client and 164 others with services to help them overcome homelessness and achieve their program goals.



INCREASE INCOME

We are thrilled by our residents' dedication to seeking and securing dependable income sources. Over the past year, employment rates increased by 83% and the number of individuals with no income source decreased by 56%.



SECURE PERMANENT HOUSING

In Fiscal Year 2016, more than 50% of the men and women who graduated from our programs moved directly into permanent housing.

We celebrate our residents' personal growth as they volunteer in the community, maintain abstinence from substance abuse, and enhance their mental and physical wellbeing.

Applied Behavioral Rehabilitation Institute, Inc.

Applied Behavioral Rehabilitation Institute, Inc. (ABRI), doing business as *Homes for the Brave*, is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit agency based in Bridgeport, Connecticut. Our staff work with clients to create personalized goals to help them achieve stable income and housing, and increase their self-determination.

Homes for the Brave

ABRI's pilot program, *Homes for the Brave (HFTB)*, is a 42-bed transitional living program for homeless male Veterans and up to five non-Veterans.

Female Soldiers: Forgotten Heroes

Female Soldiers: Forgotten Heroes is the first and only transitional housing program for women Veterans in

Connecticut. At the PFC Nicholas A. Madaras Home, *FS:FH* hosts ten beds for female Veterans and five beds, when available, for overflow and their small children.

Waldorf House

The *Waldorf Permanent Supportive Housing Program* consists of nine furnished units and provides permanent housing and case management services to formerly homeless men, with priority given to Veterans and those with histories of chronic homelessness.

Veterans Service Center

The *Homes for the Brave Veterans Service Center* provides immediate basic assistance and resources to Veterans in need. Our staff assists individuals by offering referrals to emergency and permanent housing resources, vocational counseling, assistance with benefits, and other supportive services.

Ode to Joy

In February 2016, Joy Kiss retired from ABRI after a 14-year tenure as its CEO and Executive Director.

In 2002, after more than 20 years in the medical field, Joy arrived at *Homes for the Brave* as the Program Manager. The agency looked very different from today: no money for payroll, no furnishings, no grass in the ground. To ensure the program's successful launch, Joy aggressively applied for grants and raised awareness for the organization by reaching out to civic groups, women's clubs, Veterans organizations, and anyone who would lend their ear. She authored policies and procedures and even assembled furniture in time for the first Veterans to arrive.

Joy maintained her indomitable spirit throughout her tenure and was a driving force in achieving ABRI's greatest accomplishments: saving funds to purchase *Waldorf House*, our permanent-supportive housing

program and the unrelenting battle to open *Female Soldiers: Forgotten Heroes*, Connecticut's first transitional housing program for homeless female veterans and their children.

Joy extends her eternal gratitude to our supporters for making the organization what it is today. Time after time, she has been touched by the generosity you have shown to individuals that you don't even know because you believe so deeply in our mission and their futures.

And to our residents, Joy thanks you for teaching her something new every day. She admires your strength and respect for one another and believes that "no matter what obstacles you face in life, you can overcome them; it just takes work, perseverance, and the ability to ask for help."

We at ABRI thank Joy for 14 years of service in which she paved the way for our organization and the clients we serve.



CLIENT PROFILES: *Success Stories*

CARMEN

After 9/11 Carmen felt a duty to serve her country and joined the military in 2003. She was deployed to Iraq the following year, where she was responsible for guarding the village, sweeping for bombs, checking the perimeter and more. After 18 months she was discharged, yet continued to serve in the National Guard.

By January 2015 Carmen was a single mother working two back-to-back jobs as a Certified Nursing Assistant but was unable to make ends meet. When she received an eviction notice she moved to Connecticut to be closer to family, but they could not accommodate Carmen and her three-year-old daughter on a long-term basis. After visiting and calling what seemed like an endless list of shelters that were not appropriate for a young girl, Carmen found *Female Soldiers: Forgotten Heroes*.

Carmen remembers her first day at the *PFC Nicholas A. Madaras House*. "You walk in here and it's a house. You have your own space, and people are willing to talk to you like you're a real person." In addition to the trust and



guidance she received from ABRI staff, Carmen built lasting friendships with the other residents. "Talking to other women — most of whom have children — made me feel less alone and ashamed to be in my situation."

Carmen developed a personal service plan with her case manager and returned to school while her daughter enjoyed a safe place surrounded by positive female role models and other children.

Today, Carmen is working toward a respiratory therapy degree at Norwalk Community College and pursuing a medical assistant certificate. Thanks to the stipend she receives through the G.I. Bill, she is able to maintain a home for herself and her daughter while focusing on coursework.

To any woman facing life's hardships, Carmen recommends allowing yourself to be vulnerable and asking for help before you hit rock bottom. "At the end of the day this is your fight and your struggle, but the more people and support you have behind you, the more likely you are to win the battle."

PERRY

In 1977, at age 19, Perry joined the National Guard and later transferred to the Marines, believing that serving in the military would allow him to properly support his wife and daughter.

Perry trained to be a Military Police Officer and Sniper, and after his discharge in the 80s, ultimately found his calling as a security guard. In this position, he was able to utilize many of the skills he learned in the military while making a comfortable living.

When Perry was laid off, he moved in with his mother, providing 24/7 care as her illness progressed. When she passed away, Perry was shocked to learn that she had cashed in her life insurance policy, spent the majority of her remaining funds, and never officially added Perry to her lease. Perry was given 30 days to vacate the home he thought he could occupy until he returned to work.

Perry found *Homes for the Brave*, which he credits with providing the support and stability he needed to regain



his independence. Alongside his vocational specialist and case manager, Perry prepared to reenter the workforce.

After an extensive job search and several coaching sessions, Perry secured a full-time position as an armed security guard. He now trains new associates and is encouraged by the potential to advance within a growing company.

Today Perry lives in an apartment in Bridgeport and is actively saving to own a property of his own. Perry is proud of himself for adjusting to the challenging, regimented lifestyle at *Homes for the Brave* and accepting help from the staff that genuinely believes in him.

"My advice to others is to follow the rules and give the program a chance. If you fight against it, it will come back to bite you. But if you embrace it, it will provide the stability and support you need to overcome your personal obstacles."

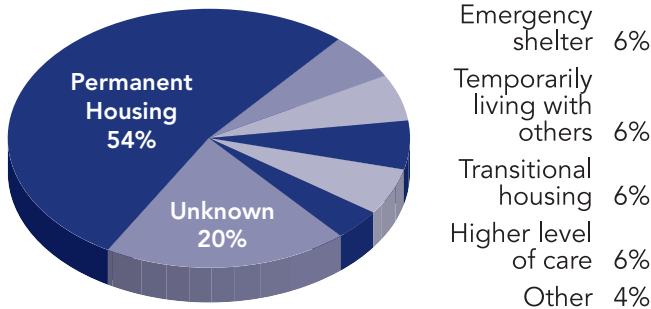

Total number served: **165**

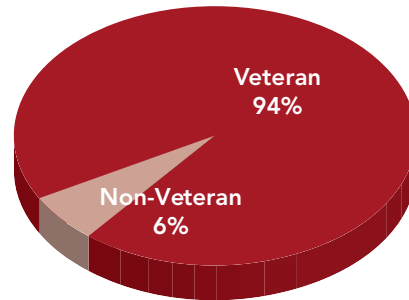
Out of the 165 individuals served this year, 108 were discharged and 57 remained in the three ABRI programs beyond June 30, 2016.

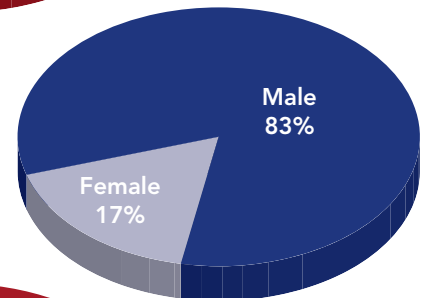

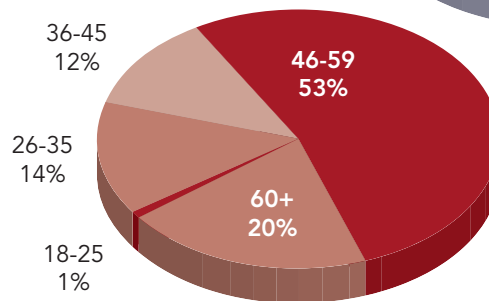
VETERAN STATUS



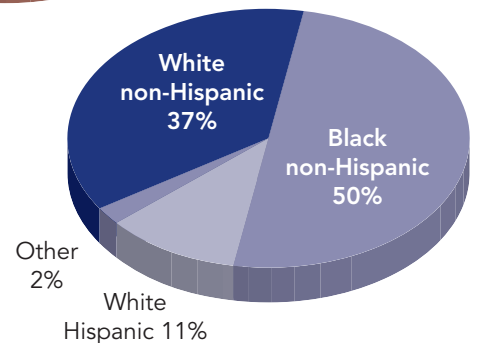
GENDER



AGE



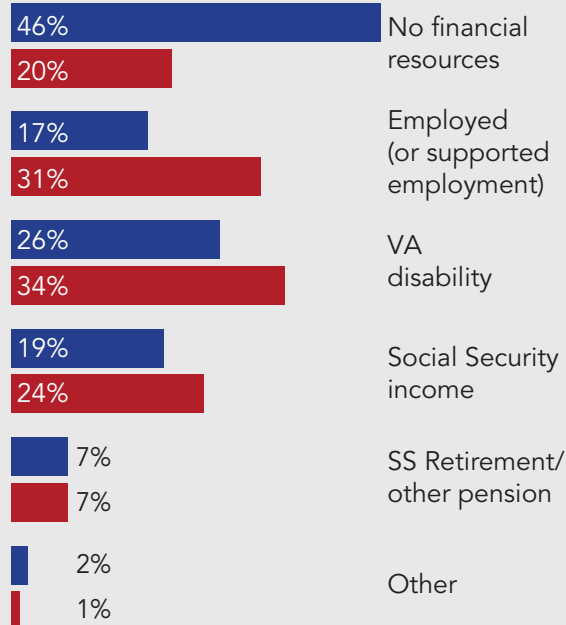
RACE/ETHNICITY
